WHAT IS THE OZARK SOCIETY?

The Ozark Society, Inc., was founded in 1962 by Dr. Neil Compton of Bentonville and a group of associates for the immediate purpose of saving the nationally famous Buffalo River from dams planned by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. Society founders helped get the National park Service to survey Buffalo River area and then began to campaign for the creation of the "Buffalo National River" as an alternative to the dams. It took ten years, but Congress passed legislation to create our nations first "national river". The Buffalo is now one of mid-America's most outstanding river-oriented attractions.

Missouri members helped stop dams on the Eleven Point and Meramec rivers and continue to champion protection of scenic rivers, natural areas, and wilderness on public lands.

The Society has remained a strong regional organization because it has remained true to the principal purpose of the preservation of wild and scenic rivers, wilderness, and unique natural areas.

The Ozark Society has members from Alaska to Florida and several foreign countries. Local autonomous chapters serve as focal points for membership activities in their area. You can join the Society as a full member or just pay for a local newsletter. Full membership entitles you to the monthly newsletter Pack & Paddle, consolidated outing schedules, conservation "action" notices, and book discounts. Local newsletter entitles you to receive only the Mississippi Valley Chapter newsletter and local outings schedule.

The Society's motto is 'Conservation - Education - Recreation' and all its activities revolve around this theme.

The Mississippi Valley Chapter of the Ozark Society has an active schedule to meet the goals of our motto.

We have a stream team and do various "pick up" activities during the year. We have also been active in trail maintenance during the past years.

We have educational programs at our meetings. We have donated books and videos to the libraries on Conservation, Hiking, and Canoeing.

We have a broad range of activities from; day hikes, canoe trips, educational trips, & tours.
