

BCOS Meeting Minutes July 17, 2018

Secretary report: accepted as typed in the newsletter. Motion made by Tom and second by Dick

Treasurer report: Dick reported that we need to be able to get the names of the new members from the Ozark Society when they receive new memberships so that they can be added to the email list.

Website: if Bayou Chapter is put in Google the Ozark Society come up. If paddle or hike in the area are entered in Google, the Bayou Chapter does not pop up.

Dick is going to send out an email of members to paid members. If you don't receive an email, please pay Dick.

Newsletter: Nothing new. Dick commented "We are getting a good newsletter". Marian requested that the contact person write up an article for the newsletter.

Publicity: Tom reported that he got the information in the newspaper and that he got a call as a result of the announcement. Tom will continue to try to add contacts for publicity. Tom needs information about 1 week ahead of events. Please let Tom if you know of any contacts that can assist in providing publicity for our group.

Conservation report: Sandy reported on the efforts being made to increase the Whooping crane population. Whooping cranes are about 5 feet tall and have a wing span of about 7 feet. In 2011 they were reintroduced in LA. Now there are 72 in LA which is up from the original 4. Now chicks are hatching in the nests. The work is being done at the Audubon Species Survival Center.

Old Business: Roy announced: The Roberts' tract is the property that the Ozark Society purchased to complete the Buffalo River hiking trail. The property cost \$51,000. The Ozark Society is wanting to raise \$80,000 which includes \$29,000 for an endowment. The Highland Chapter donated \$5000 toward the Roberts' tract. A discussion was held. Sandy made a motion that the Bayou Chapter donate \$500 towards that purchase of the property. Kathy K seconded the motion. There was no further discussion by anyone. A vote was conducted. All were in favor, none opposed.
