The January meeting was an informative time to learn what specifically we can do during the current AR Legislature to protect the River. The bottom line- call your local AR legislator and let them know that the Buffalo National River(BNR) is Arkansas' crown jewel, that it provides jobs and economic benefit to Newton, Searcy and Marion Counties. Talk about your personal experiences. Ask your legislator if they will help us support the protection of the BNR and will they contact you if they hear of a proposed bill that could harm our efforts to protect the river. Another opportunity is partnering with AR Audubon on their solar energy initiative. They are working to pass legislation in AR that would allow for 3rd party payment to install solar energy capability in homes and businesses. We are happy to announce that the Colorado High Adventure Trip is on for 2019!!!! Here is the information from Catherine Tolson. And a huge "Thank You" to Catherine for organizing the trip once again.

### COLORADO HIGH ADVENTURE TRIP - July 14-20, 2019

The 2019 Colorado High Adventure Trip will be held from **Sunday thru Saturday, July 14 – 20**, at **Cascade Campground** located in the Collegiate Peaks area west of the community of Nathrop, Colorado. If you prefer motel accommodations to camping, you can make reservations at nearby motels or bed & breakfasts. The trip is limited to 60 people. The cost of the trip is **\$175 for campers** or **\$125 for** those who choose the **motel or B&B option**. You will need to complete the Trip Form and include it with your fees. The Trip Form. It is also available at the Ozark Society website under Outings and Activities: <https://www.ozarksociety.net/> and it will be in the Spring issue of the Pack and Paddle newsletter.

You must be an Ozark Society member to participate in this trip. Only paid trip participants who sign waivers will be allowed to join group-led activities. If you are not already a member, you may join by paying your dues online at [www.ozarksociety.net/membership/](http://www.ozarksociety.net/membership/) or by sending \$30 annual dues along with trip fee of \$175 for campers or \$125 for non-campers.

Reservations will be accepted between January 15th and May 31st, 2019. Please be sure your reservation arrives by May 31st at the latest. To confirm your place on the Colorado outing, mail your completed **Trip Form** with your **check** made out to *Ozark Society* to:

Meals will be provided for all trip participants, regardless of whether you are camping or staying elsewhere. The meals will begin with dinner on Sunday, July 14 and end with dinner on Friday, July 19. If you have special dietary needs or preferences, you may need to bring your own food as the menus are planned well in advance of the trip.

There will be a variety of outings from which to choose: hiking, fishing, mountain biking, horseback riding, sightseeing, and rafting or boating on the Arkansas River. If you plan to canoe, kayak, or bike, you should bring your own equipment. For rafting, you will need to make your own arrangements with a local outfitter.
