One project of the fund is the Lower Mississippi Alluvial Valley Reforestation Initiative which aims to reforest at least one million acres throughout Louisiana, Mississippi, Arkansas, Tennessee, Kentucky, Missouri, and Illinois.

#### **Old Business**

Adoption of the children's area at the Red River Wildlife Refuge – Roy O'Neal reported on the recent cleanup of the area by BCOS. Sandy Roerig has asked Ranger Terry for a list of things needed for the area. It was decided that BCOS needs clarification of what the refuge is asking from us before voting to take on this project permanently.

### Caddo Lake Paddle - September 19, 2020

On Saturday September 19th, Marian Howard and Jenny and Gary Hackman drove over to Caddo Lake for a paddle. They met Diane Jones, a friend of hers from California and me at our launching point on Pine Island Pond off Dorough Road. It was a nice, cool, sunny, breezy, almost Autumn day.

We launched and paddled about 0.8 mi. to where Pine Island Pond joins Big Cypress Bayou and headed about 0.8 mi. upstream to Carney Canal. As we approached the mouth of Carney Canal, a fisherman commented on the bad odor which we had not experienced up to that point. When we entered the canal, it hit us. It smelled like a sewer, the water was a dark grey color and motor boats would leave a trail of foam. The lake had "turned over" as the expression goes. This is a natural phenomenon and there are several things that can cause this, wind and cooler weather among a couple. At the upper end of Carney, about 0.7 miles further, we hooked a left and went into Willowson's Woodyard and made about a one mile loop, finding our way back to Carney Canal. While in Willowson's Woodyard, there was no foul odor. From there we entered Carter Lake (and the odor) and paddled north about 1.25 mi. to Smith Slough. Smith Slough is about 0.65 mi. and is a pretty, shady, winding slough through a cypress and hardwood forest area that leads back to Big Cypress Bayou downstream of our launch site. At that point there was no more odor and we paddled about 1.25 miles upstream and through Pine Island Pond back to our point of origin. The whole trip took about 2.25 hours and was about 6.5 mi. long.

After loading up the boats, Marian, Jenny, Gary and I went to the nearby River Bend Restaurant and had a nice meal outside on the upper deck.

The normal seasonal turning brown of the cypress trees won't happen for most of Caddo Lake this year. The looper worm has already turned the foliage on most of the trees brown. Fortunately, this does not kill the trees. a

We plan to do more paddles on Caddo Lake this fall. Hope you can join us!

### **Open Letter To All BCOS Members**

To new members, old members and guests:

Since we have many new members and older members who have asked about our events and why we have so many community service activities, let me share. BCOS has three main areas of activities - Hiking, Paddling and Community Service/Conservation.

The first two are self explanatory. Hiking is mostly done in the colder months when we have less bugs, snakes and visibility in the woods is best. They can be local hikes of a few hours or set up for overnight stays with hikes each day. The paddles are more often scheduled in the warmer months. This takes into account water temps and wind conditions. The primary waters we visit have been flat waters such as lakes, bayous or slower rivers. This doesn't rule out white water paddles. We haven't scheduled those in the last few years but could.

The last area is community service, usually tied to conservation and clean ups. Some of the events are Shreveport Duck Pond cleanup, a couple hours about twice a year. The Red River Cleanup which is an annual event in November along the river waterways. This event was cancelled in 2020. Bodcau / Rt 157 boat launch area, a few hours about twice a year picking up trash. The OWL Center in Dubach, La. which involves clearing trails for horses, bikes and hikers used for therapy. This is a couple of days a year for several hours each day. We have also now partnered up with the Red River National Wildlife Refuge to adopt the Youth learning area of the grounds. This is new so hours and needs are being worked out.

The Conservation area sounds like a great deal of time and effort is expended. Truly we have a large number of members who highly enjoy these activities. That being said, this doesn't preclude other events from occurring on those days. If folks don't participate in the conservation area, they can schedule a hike or paddle on those days. Not everyone likes community service and that's ok and some folks feel the need to be at each event and that's fine too. If someone would like to lead an alternative activity on community service days just announce where, when and plan a separate event. I'm sure others will join you.
