# **Outings Update**

The February hike for Pulaski Chapter took place on the 11th to the Sylamore Trail in North Central Arkansas. Six members from Little Rock met with three from the Mountain Home area at the Gunner Pool campground, just outside Fifty-Six. We left a car here and pooled over to our start at Barkshed campground. Our hike would be along the north bank of the Sylamore Creek downstream to Gunner Pool, not quite five miles.

For a majority of the hike we walked above the stream, along hillsides and cliff faces. The hike is a very visual one as several bluff lines come in to play. We saw many overhangs and a couple of non running waterfalls and views of the white water on the stream below us from cliff overlooks.

It was a cool, but sunny day, and the conditions were very enjoyable. We made good time and completed the hike around two. The car retrieval took forty minutes and while that was going on, those left behind explored the Gunner Pool campground. There is an old WPA dam and pond here on a side creek and the actual Gunner Pool on the Sylamore just upstream from the camp. This is a great swimming hole in Summer. *Photos of the hike are on the Ozark Society website, look under Chapters and outings and click on Pulaski.* 

The March hike will be about the same length, bur a bit closer to Little Rock. On March 11 we will meet at 8 am at the Chik-fil-a next to Bass Pro in SW Little Rock. We will then carpool over to the Lovit Trail, west of Hot Springs. Our hike will start and finish on Hickory Nut Mountain. We will follow the trail along a stream down the mountain to an abandoned road for the climb and view on Hickory Nut Mountain. Hope you can make it out for a great early spring hike on 3/11.

Don't forget the car camp on 4/14 to 4/16 at Ozark campground, north of Jasper. Canoe, day hike, and car camp with fellow Society members. Do it all or stay in camp, it will be a fun weekend. And meals can be just ten minutes away in Jasper.

Lots of fun things ahead yet this spring. We have the hike in Memphis in May and an overnight float on the Buffalo in June. Come on out for some outdoor fun!

# PULASKI CHAPTER OUTING SCHEDULE WINTER/SPRING 2023

#### MARCH 11 - LOVIT TRAIL - HICKORY NUT MT. LOOP - MOD. 5 MILES.

We will walk a loop from the top of Hickory Nut Mt. down the Lovit trail and back on abandoned county roads. One big hill at the end. Be at Chik-fil-A near Bass Pro at 8am to carpool down. You will need boots, lunch and water.

#### APRIL 14, 15 & 16 - OZARK CAMPGROUND CAR CAMP AND DAY HIKES - EASY

We were rained out last fall, but let's try this spring. We will gather at the Ozark Campground on the Buffalo, north of Jasper, for a car camp. Some of us will come up Friday night, the rest on Saturday. Town is 10 minutes away, so you don't have to cook if you don't want to. There are two planned day hikes on the BRT. The 1st from Ozark to Pruitt (2.6 m) and then the Mill Creek Loop (1.5 m) on Sat. at 10. On Sunday we will hike from Ponca to Steel Creek (2.6 m). If you just want to hang out in camp, that's fine too! Come have some fun and fellowship. Look for the Banner in the campground.

#### MAY 6 – BIG RIVER PED. BRIDGE AND BEALE STREET (MEMPHIS) EASY 5.5 MILES

Spend a spring day walking on a historic bridge and having lunch on Beale Street. Its been one of our favorite hikes, even though its urban. We start from the W. Memphis end of the bridge and cross over the Big Muddy then on to Beale for lunch. We meet at the trail head off Exit 1 of I-55 in W. Memphis. Take I-55 to Memphis. After exiting, take a left to Dacus Lake Rd. to the parking. Be there by 10:45. It is a 2 ¼ hour drive from Little Rock. Hike begins at 10:45, bring good shoes and some water.
