2. Ideas for Chapter Follow-up

- 3. Start a conversation with local politicians about a particular issue in play or about starting a new initiative.
- 4. Start a book club focused on reading books and articles about climate change to become better informed.

- 7. Collaborate with other environmental organizations, student groups and OS partners on a project.
- 8. Organize a focus group of representatives of interest groups such as agriculture, parks and recreation, natural resources, health care, education, utilities, etc. to find common ground.
- 9. Practice recycling, reusing, repurposing, as well as carpooling, promoting EVs (work with car dealerships) and energy efficiency.
