Flat Water - Grassy Lake (secluded cypress/tupelo gum swamp), Maumelle River, Lake Maumelle (flat water touring),
Whitewater - Cadron Creek (class 1,2), South Fork of Fourche River (class 1,2)
Biking - 10-40 mile cycling tours starting and ending at Ferncliff

Saturday night entertainment: Live music & swing dance

- Please pre-register and pay for sleeping arrangements and cafeteria meals by the **April 1 deadline** so that Ferncliff can plan staffing and accommodations appropriately (see financial page)
- The Ozark Society has reserved the north 40 acres of Ferncliff for our exclusive use, but there are lots of things to do at Ferncliff (swimming, canoeing, fishing, biking, hiking, etc. on site). They have found that a \$12/person facilities fee is reasonable for all that is available it is a good deal. In order to encourage families and students though, we have decided to reduce the facilities fee for students to \$5.

1 PM, Sat Bike touring, 10-40 miles cycling tours – Leader, Janet Nye, meet under the tunnel

Janet will lead a circuit on hard surface roads that will appeal to various riding goals.

9 AM, Sun Whitewater canoe and kayak (depends on water levels) – meet at Ferncliff tunnel

Cadron Creek - 56 miles N on hy 65 (64 min) or South Fork of the Fourche River – 65 miles west of Ferncliff in the Ouachita Mts.

Recreation on site:

7.4 miles of maintained hiking trails, 4.8 miles mountain bike (bring you own bike), 2 small lakes for canoeing and kayaking, labyrinth, 120' shady shoot slide, hammock circle

Nearby Hiking: Ouachita Trail (see FoOt website) **Hillary Hollow, Nancy Mt.** (4.6 miles round trip), 4 miles south Williams Junction (hy 9 & 10) on hy 9. **Flatside Wilderness** (access at Flatside Pinnacle, 11 miles to fr 124). **Pinnacle Mt.** (round trip, see directing signs along hy 10)

Note: With prior notification it may be possible to shuttle hikers to trailheads on the Ouachita trail
