Presentation: Dawn Boyter- Geologist and environmental enthusiast with OFX Eco Solutions. Topic: Artificial Oyster Reef.

LA has the largest loss of land of the US states. Oysters enhance the water quality and are a keystone species which impacts the entire ecosystem. They have been working with LA Tech to develop a geopolymer to be used for oysters to attach to in the water.




Backwater Jack's Paddle Weekend on Big Cypress Bayou
