A suggestion was made that by Tammy J, on behalf of Cindy B, that we cancel the PO Box due to it costing \$210.00 per year and the only mail that goes to the PO Box anymore is the crawfish boil money. Otherwise, the only mail that is received is junk mail. The OS sends the funds from membership electronically. The mail box renewal is scheduled for June. Cindy doesn't feel that the PO Box is needed anymore at this time. The PO Box number has been removed from all of our literature that is handed out. Cindy reports that when things need to be mailed in to the club, they can go to her home. Grace E made a motion that we cancel the PO Box and it was second by Kim C. Discussion that was added was the possibility of sending the mail to the RRNWR by Phillip. All were in favor of cancelling the PO Box. Tammy J will let Cindy B know.
