## **BCOS Meeting Minutes - November 18, 2025**

Meeting was called to order by Tammy J. at 6:30 pm

Visitors were welcomed.

Minutes were approved as written in the newsletter by a motion made by Barbie and 2nd by Grace. No one opposed.

Presentation by Randy "Batman" Fulco. Randy spoke about his bats and bat houses that he builds. He reports that bats eat about 1000 mosquitoes per hour. The houses that he builds are a 2'x2' minimal. He recommends that the houses be placed between 12-14 feet high. It takes 2-3 years for bats to find it. The bats use an echo location. He reports that the houses face south to southeast. He suggests that 2" holes be drilled into the interior boards, but not lined up. This allows for the bats to move around and helps with air circulation. The houses that he builds are made of 3/8 plywood. He makes the back 30" long to allow for a 6" landing zone. He places a ¾' spacer between the 2'x2' boards. He paints the houses light brown so that the houses don't get too hot. He uses untreated wood made of pine or cedar. Don't paint the inside of the houses. He reports that the bats can fly up to 100 mph and that they fly hundreds of miles a night and return. Bats help with pollination. There are 300+ species of bats and in the TX and LA area there are 3 types. He reports that the pole needs to be within a ¼ mile of water and 20 to 30' from the woods. He puts a shingle roof on the top. He reports that the spacers need to be replaced about every 6 years. He has 3 bat houses.

Announcement by Gary Knippers from KBB. KBB has trees that they have been trying to give away the past 2 weekends. He reports that this is in honor of Arbor day. He still has some trees. He preposes that cypress trees and a redbud tree be planted near the beach area as a memorial to Dick Maxwell. Sandy mentioned that this will need to be discussed with the Friends group and the master gardener.

Wayne K made an announcement about the Memorial service for Dick Maxwell. It will be on Friday 5-7 pm at Roseneath on Airline.

Lake Bistineau: the gates are now closed and it is now filling up.

Membership Renewal is now being generated by the software. There is now a 3 year renewal option. If you renew the month prior to the expiration date, the expiration date remains the same

Cypress Lake boat launch on highway 162 will be building a kayak boat launch

Grace E gave an update on the Athens-Big Fork Historical Marker. It has gotten approved. The sign is now being made and will be shipped to the Big Fork Mall. The local running club in the area will be placing mile markers on the trail. The marker will be on Highway 8. The running club does trail maintenance on the trail also. The running club has raised \$1400.00 to help with the sign and mile markers. The running club has asked if we would split the cost of the marker and the mile markers and have their name on the marker also. A proposal was made by Sandy R that BCOS and the running club split the cost of the marker and mile markers. Second by Wayne K. Discussion was had regarding the signs will be cemented into the ground for the mile markers and the historical marker. The entire cost at this time for the total project is \$2,607. The motion was approved. None opposed.

The children's play area at the Refuge was cleaned up. Tammy sent a proposal for the area to the ranger and the Friends group. It was suggested that the entrance sign be hung, an upgrade to the count and sort area, a fishing area have a canoe with fishing poles with a magnet for a lure and life jackets be place close by, a habitat be built by Bossier BISTIL possibly with cubbies to place unique items found in the area, a tree house with wind chimes made from bamboo, the stage have a backdrop for kids to do skits with costumes that are available in the store, the hollow cypress log is still there, that the balance beams area also have some wood rounds for the kids to walk on, that a rope spider web be placed in the area, there are animal print stepping stones, a swing hanging from a tree limb be placed in the gathering area, and the eagle scout table is still in good shape. A wilderness area as per the 1956 National act states that there be no permanent buildings, no paved roads, no motor vehicles and no trails be present. There are 3 Wilderness areas in LA. Wellborn Jack fell in love with the Caney Creek Wilderness when he went down in the area while in the armed forces. He had to hike out. He later did pro bono work to save the Caney Creek Wilderness Area.
